Extreme weather

Strange and dangerous patterns of weather like blizzards.

Spring

A season defined by blooming flowers.

Summer

A season defined by warm conditions.

Autumn

A season defined by harvest and falling leaves.

Winter

A season defined by cold weather and snow.

Weather Forecaster

A person who predicts what the weather will be like.


Snow often falls in Winter.
