Coastline

The point at which the land meets the sea.

Beach

A narrow strip of land that sits on a coastline.

Cliff

A landform of rock that rises straight up from the ground.

Sand dunes

A mound of sand formed by the wind blowing.

Bay

A small body of water on a coastline.

Harbour

A small body of water protected from ocean/sea.

Pier

A raised area over a body of water.

Tourism

The movement of people to a particular place.

Port

A place for boats to dock.

Ocean

A large body of water and one of the 5 oceans of the world

Sea

A body of water that is smaller than an ocean.

We are learning to:

- name, locate and identify the four countries of the UK and its surrounding seas.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to: key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, sea, ocean, season and weather
- As well as key human features, including: city, town, village, house, port, harbour and shop



Our Lessons

- To locate the main bodies of water and some key seaside resorts in the UK.
- To identify key physical features of a coastline
- To identify key human features of a coastline
- Compare features of a Coastline with Hertford.
- To begin to understand why people visit the seaside.
- Recognise that parts of the UK coast have changed over time.
