#### **Physical features**


Features of the landscape that occur naturally.

#### Landmarks

Places within countries of great historical, cultural or geographical importance.

#### **Grid References**

A way to identify a particular place on a map.

### **Our Lessons**


- To locate the world's most populous and least populous countries.
