Trade

Is the exchange of goods and services between people around the world.

Goods

Items needed or wanted by people such as clothes or food.

Supply chain

The journey goods take from raw materials to a finished item.

Import

Something brought by a country from another.

Export

The opposite. Something sold by a country to another.

Fairtrade

Trade when a fair price is paid to the original farmer or producer.

Buying

Giving money in exchange for goods.

Selling

Receiving money in exchange for goods.

Globalisation

The name of the process for how things grow from a local to a global scale.
