

Unlike Roman or modern soldiers, Viking warriors weren't provided with a uniform or equipment, they had to dress and arm themselves.

#### Viking weapons

Fighting was an important part of Viking life so every man would have owned weapons. Karls - spears and knives.

Kings and jarls - swords and large axes. Weapons would have been handed down through the family or the warriors would have been buried with them.
