

Aims



Beginning of the school day

• Queens and Mandeville school gates will be open at 8.35am and children in Y5 should be lined up on the "Bus" playground by 8.40am. We will then lead in the children to start the day.



The end of the school day

At end of the school day, Y5 children are to be collected from the "Bus" playground by their adult at 3.20pm. Please let us know of any changes to pick-up in the morning so we do not need to check at the time of pick-up.



Preparation for Year 5

As a reminder, please ensure your child returns to school in the required uniform along with:

- PE kit and art apron all labelled.
 Children will be changing at school for PE lessons so the kit will need to remain in school each week.
- Named water bottle each day.
- Stationery/pencil cases to be named:

2 black pens for handwriting, HB pencil, ruler, glue stick, rubber, sharpener, 2 highlighters.



The following items are part of our **essential** school uniform:

Navy blue v-necked jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan. Hoodies are not permitted

Light blue polo shirt

Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress

Light blue, round neck PE t-shirt

Plain navy blue PE shorts (not cycling shorts)

PE trainers (velcro unless pupil can tie laces)

Black school shoes - trainers, boots, sandals or shoes with heels are not permitted

Optional school uniform

- Navy blue jumper/cardigan with school logo
- Light blue PE t-shirt with school logo
- Plain (not branded) navy blue joggers/tracksuit for PE during winter months
- Light blue gingham summer dresses during summer term (until Autumn half term)

Uniform continued...

There are no restrictions on the colour of school coats

School bags/rucksacks should be large enough to carry school equipment e.g. reading book, one pencil case, jotter, packed lunch and water bottle

Jewellery is not permitted unless it is worn for religious reasons. Pupils with pierced ears may wear small stud earrings only. Earrings must be removed for PE/sports activities

Smartwatches/Fitbits are not permitted

Long hair (shoulder length or longer) must be tied back at all times

Small hair accessories must be navy blue, black or brown

Nail varnish is not permitted.

Haircuts should be appropriate for school






Behaviour

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

Home Learning

- Please read at home every day (write a comment in reading record if you have read with your child). We will check and sign reading records regularly.
- Practise weekly times tables (TTRockstars is a great way to do this).

e-Safety across Key Stage 2

• Children must not publish images of other pupils



- Please ensure your child is using their device under your supervision
- Minimum ages for Instagram (13+), WhatsApp (16+), Facebook (13+), Snapchat (13+)
- We will contact you if we suspect a pupil is misusing their device
- Talk about your child's eSafety with them so they know they can come to you or any school adult with problems
- It is important that pupils feel safe to discuss worries and that they will not lose access to their device if they do make a mistake

Phones and safety

The school's view is that **no pupil** needs the use of a mobile phone.

If parents wish to supply their child with a phone, it should be for reasons of their **safety.**

It is the school's view that **all social media** and messaging apps are <u>unsafe</u> for pupils to use.

We ask for you to support the school in discouraging the use of phones by pupils, and in particular use of messaging and social media apps.



Phones and **safety**

If you make the decision to give your child a phone, we suggest you use a parental control app such as Google Family Link or Qustodio to monitor your child's phone use closely, and that you actively supervise all online activity.



We also **strongly suggest** that you do not allow your child to contact other pupils using messaging apps, and that parents communicate directly with each other.

We also **strongly recommend** that you do not allow the download of any social media apps, which we have seen to be harmful to pupils.





Safeguarding
