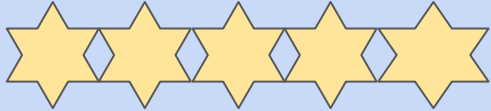

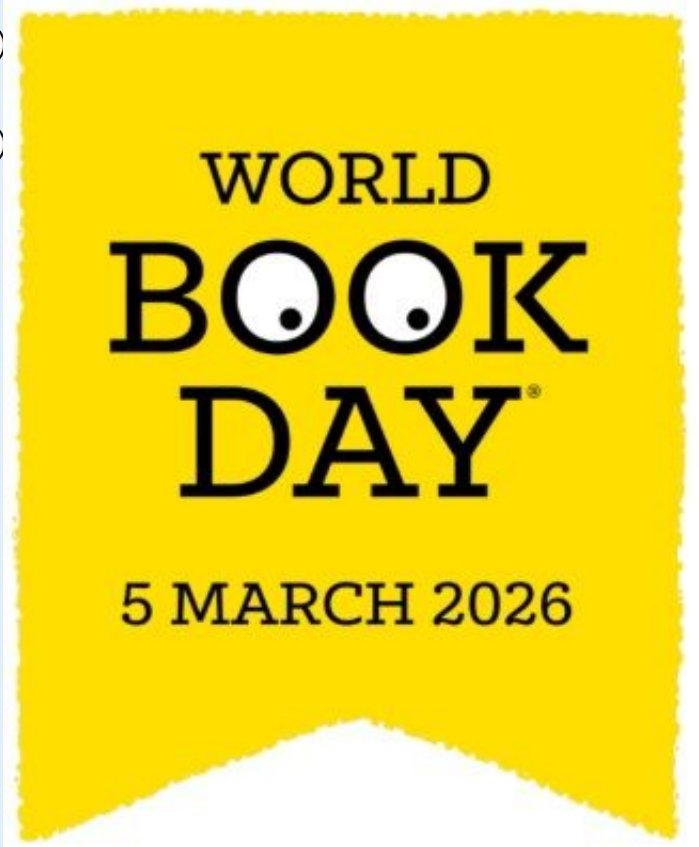

On Thursday, the Year 5 and 6 children were lucky enough to be able to participate in a 'Stage Craft' workshop run by the actors who performed the production of the 'Wizard of Oz' to the school.

The children learned:

- there were 17 characters in the play and all were performed by just 4 actors in a process called 'multi rolling'.
- that the sets are all hand painted and are reused - this set is about 10 years old but doesn't look like it has really aged.
- scenes are changed according to key words that are used within the play. The children had the opportunity to come up with a key word - Beckett chose 'Whack' and used it to make the scenery change which they thoroughly enjoyed doing.
- Charlie in Year 5 said, 'I really enjoyed finding out how they made it look like the Wicked Witch just disappeared from the stage having had water thrown at her. It was really cool!'
- 'Props' is short for properties and the children enjoyed handling Glinda's wand, the tin man's oil can and Toto!
- Costumes are organised by the wardrobe department and that costumes are not just clothes but are for portraying more about the characters themselves.
- Quick changes are helped by using layering and quick fastenings such as zips and velcro

and most impressively...

The cast rehearse for just two weeks to learn how to put the set up and down, learn the lines, all of the choreography and have all of their costume changes!

Having learned how the actors control the sound and lights - with a machine they call R2D2 - the children then had a go at being the scarecrow by thinking about his body movement, facial expression and accent whilst saying, 'I don't know because I haven't got a brain.' There were a lot of interesting looking and sounding scarecrows!
